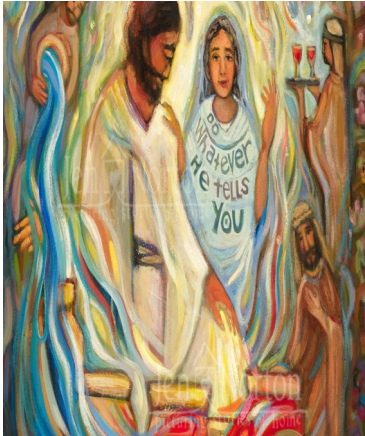


St. Francis of Assisi, Isleworth
